#### Imperial Units

	Metric	Imperial	
Length	mm, cm, m, km	inch, foot, yard, mile	
	$1 \text{cm} \approx 0.4 \text{ inch}$ $1 \text{m} \approx 3  \frac{1}{4} \text{ feet}$ $1 \text{ inch} \approx 2.5 \text{ cm}$ $1 \text{ foot (12 inches)} \approx 30 \text{ cm}$		
Mass	g, kg, tonne	Ounce (oz), pound (lb), stone	
	1 kg ≈ 2.2 pounds 1 pound ≈ 450g		
Capacity	ml, l	pint, gallon	
	4 ½ litre ≈ 1 gallon  1 litre ≈ 1.75 pints  1 pint ≈ 570ml




