Weekly:

Times table practice/Disrali 99 sheet - weekly tests. Practice the number you are on.

Reading - ideally 4 times a week.

Spelling - Children will be given 4 new spellings a week to learn. Tests will happen on a Friday. New spellings will appear in Reading Records on a Monday.

Accelerated Reader:

All children have taken an Accelerated Reading test which has given them a ZPD. This relates to the level of book they can read both in school and at home. It is really helpful to discuss the book with your child, question them - not just listening to them read. When the children know the book really well they take a quiz, with the aim of getting 85% or more. With this in mind, please ensure that reading records and books are in school every day.

On Thursday 28th September we will be having a whole school Poetry Day where the children will be learning about different types of poems.
