
## HOME SCHOOL AGREEMENT

- endeavour to ensure your child/children are safe and secure whilst in school.
- encourage children to do their best at all times;
- keep parents informed about School activities through regular newsletters;
- inform parents what children will be doing during the course of the year;
- arrange parents' meetings during which progress will be discussed;
- set and monitor homework for children as outlined in the Homework Policy;

## We seek your agreement to:

- ensure your child is safe and secure whilst arriving and departing school.
- make sure that your child arrives on time (lessons start at 8.45)
- make sure that your child attends regularly, providing a note of explanation for absence and avoiding holidays in term time, and occasional days off;
- attend open evenings to discuss your child's progress;
- support your child in learning to read and in completing homework;
- support the School's policy on behaviour;
- ensure your child is well rested, eats well and is ready to learn.

- tackle any special needs which may arise;
- encourage children to join lunchtime and after school clubs;
