At Mount Charles, our Early Years Foundation Stage is where learning really begins.

Early years form the foundations of your child's ongoing education and that is why we passionately believe in making a child's first years in school as stimulating, memorable and inspiring as possible.

Our environment is exceptionally well equipped for both indoor and outdoor 'learning through play' activities and the children have direct access to the outdoor area, which they use throughout the year. They are encouraged to decide where they work and learn.

Our dedicated staff work hard to ensure every child feels secure and happy.





We ensure every child is a 'unique child' who is constantly learning and can be resilient, capable, confident and self-assured.

We pride ourselves on our 'positive relationships', enabling all children to be strong and independent through caring and secure relationships with our staff. We endeavour to create 'enabling environments', which support and extend all children's development and learning and in which their experiences respond to their individual needs. There is a strong partnership between practitioners and parents and carers.

We fully understand that children 'develop and learn' in different ways and we provide education and care for all children in early years, including those with special educational needs and disabilities.

Teaching and learning ensures that the opportunities to explore key skills within the seven areas are provided through an exciting and supportive environment and a carefully planned curriculum. This is informed by the children's interests and ensures they are active participants in their learning and development.

A balance of adult directed and child initiated activities take place both in the classroom and outside in the secure outdoor learning area. Observation of play by all adults supports the curriculum and informs the next steps in their learning.

Building on what the children already know and understand enables them to develop and make progress at their own pace so that they can continue to enjoy learning.

We know that having great relationships with parents / carers is critical for your child's success in school. We have an open door policy and communicate what your children have been learning regularly through Tapestry - an online learning journal. We hold termly parent consultations and send a written report home during the summer term.

Before the children start, there are several opportunities to visit their new learning environment and staff in the school. The children are visited at home by two of the EYFS Team and parents are invited to an Open Evening to find out about life at school before commencing their all-important 'first day'.



Our Curriculum

We develop and enrich the National Curriculum to ensure an exciting, engaging and meaningful education, dividing learning into three main areas.



We teach English through Read, Write Inc. and Language and Literacy, a consistent whole-school approach to teaching children reading, writing and spelling. We enrich these programmes by embedding drama, speaking and listening opportunities, where possible linking these to our topics.

Teachers use mastery approaches to teaching maths throughout the school using practical resources. We focus on developing fluency, reasoning and problem solving.

We have an exciting science and IT curriculum with an abundance of hands on practical work. We are well resourced with a designated IT suite and over 80 iPads across the school.





We regularly evaluate our creative, topic based curriculum to ensure that it enthuses the children and hooks them into learning.

Music and creative arts have a prominent place within our curriculum. All children are given the opportunity to perform and develop confidence.

We have a designated non-class based Music / Creative Arts Lead Teacher who ensures quality specialist teaching.





Mount Charles has a long history of outstanding sporting success and we pride ourselves on the range and quality of our sporting opportunities.

We have two designated non-class based PE / Sports Lead Teachers and a number of other talented sports specialist teachers throughout the school. All children access at least two hours of PE every week. Children also swim regularly in KS2 and we have outstanding success ensuring that the vast majority of children can swim 25 metres or more by the end of Year 6. We believe strongly in outdoor adventurous education and offer residential trips and other outdoor activities throughout KS2.

Personal, Social, Health Education (PSHE) is at the heart of everything we do in school. We support children to develop emotionally to ensure that they behave as positive role models. We promote opportunities for children to be leaders and encourage independence and responsibility. We have an active School Council that meet every week to discuss school issues, work on specific projects, liaise with partner schools and fundraise for school initiatives and charities.

We have recently been developing our outdoor spaces and take our learning outdoors wherever possible.
