## Remembrance at Our School and Its Link to British Values

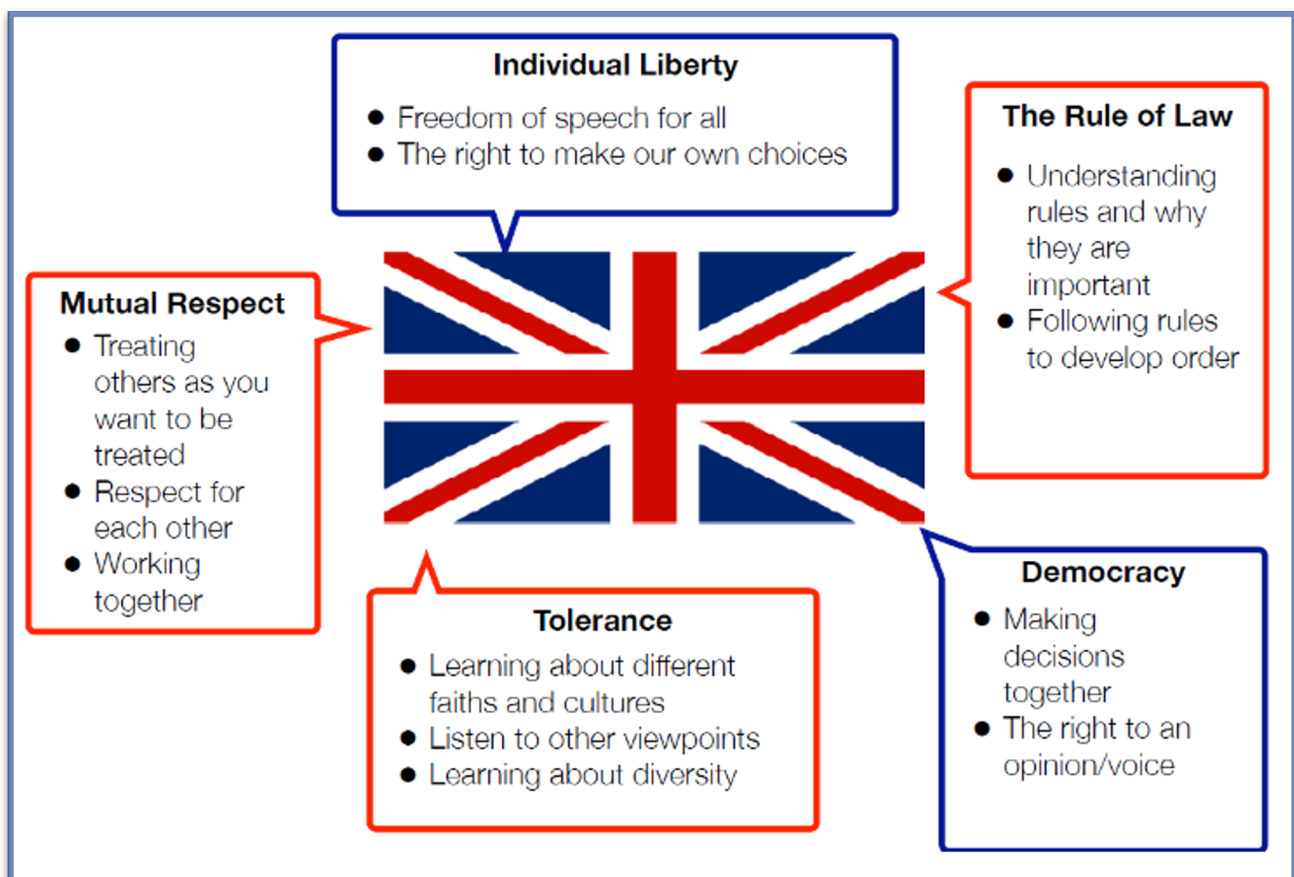
Our school community came together to mark **Remembrance**, a special time each year when we pause to honour the men and women who have served, and continue to serve, in the armed forces. Our Remembrance events help us think about the courage, dedication, and sacrifices made to protect our freedoms.

Across the school, children took part in activities to deepen their understanding. Classes created a poppy wreath and silhouette artwork. They listened to stories and poems, and learned about the history of the poppy as a symbol of remembrance. On Friday, the whole school gathered for a thoughtful assembly, where children reflected on what peace means to them. On the 11th November at 11 o'clock, everyone observed a quiet two-minute silence together. It was a moment of stillness and respect, showing how even young children can engage meaningfully with Remembrance in a calm and reflective way.

Remembrance is strongly connected to **British Values**, which form an important part of our curriculum and school ethos. The value of **Respect** is at the heart of our commemorations, as we show gratitude to those who have served and to everyone who works to keep our country safe. **Democracy** and **The Rule of Law** are also central: we remember the people who defended these principles and helped ensure we live in a society where everyone has a voice and our rights are protected.

Finally, Remembrance encourages us to think about **Tolerance** and **Mutual Understanding**, reminding us that peace is built when people work together and support one another.

Our Remembrance activities not only help children learn about an important part of British history, but also strengthen the values that guide us as a school and as members of our community.

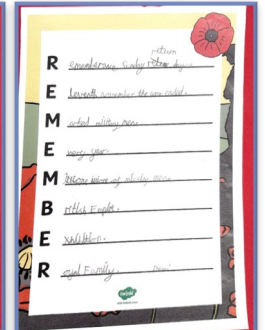
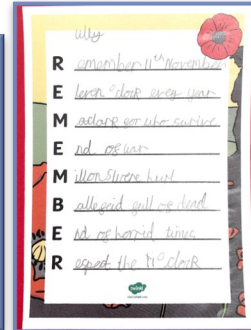
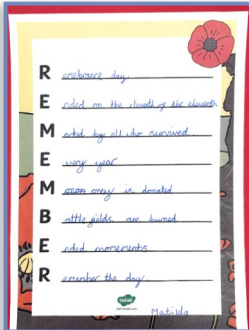
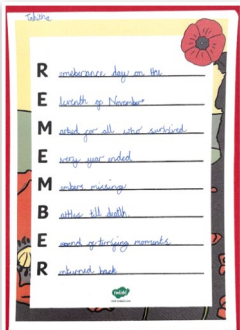
Year 3 marked Remembrance Day by creating beautiful silhouette artwork inspired by the themes of peace and remembrance. The children also took part in thoughtful discussions about why we celebrate this day and what we remember. They said, "We remember the brave soldiers who fought for us so we can have a better life now."



# YEAR 4

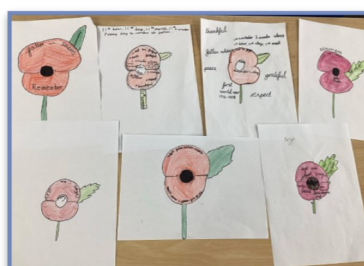
Year 4 explored the history of Remembrance and why Remembrance Sunday holds such importance today. They looked at how and why people pause to reflect on those who served and sacrificed, and discussed symbols such as the poppy and the two-minute silence.

Using a shared word bank, the children then created their own acrostic poems using the word **Remember**. They chose powerful vocabulary, thought carefully about tone, and worked hard to express respect and understanding through their writing.



# YEAR 5

Year 5 marked Remembrance Day by learning about the poppy and its significance at this time of year. The children read poems by World War One poets and thought about the words and phrases they used. They then drew their own poppies and added their thoughts about remembrance to their artwork.

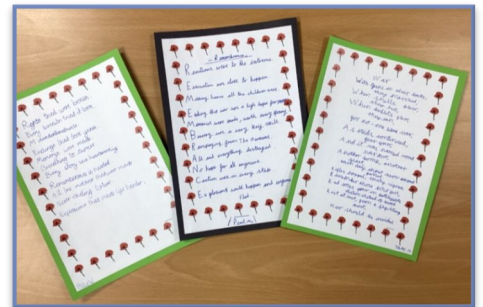
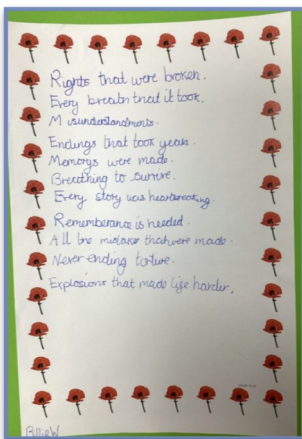
## Evacuee Day

The children were able to have two days dressed up as World War Two evacuees as part of our 'A child's War' topic. They learnt about why children were evacuated and the different places they were evacuated from and too. They also placed key information regarding the causes of and build up to World War Two on a time-line. Learning about the Treaty of Versaille and appeasement and their roles in the war.

The children completed a walk to St. Austell station and heard first hand accounts of evacuation and the war written by people from the St. Austell area. Learning that a train with evacuees on was almost bombed, due to being mistaken for one carrying troops. There was also an air raid during the day and children took shelter under tables!

## Remembrance

After listening to extracts from some inspiring World War One poetry and discussing there key features, the children chose a key word or words as inspiration to create a poem dedicated to the ethos of remembrance - 'Lest we forget.'



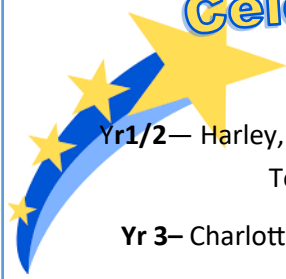
# ARB

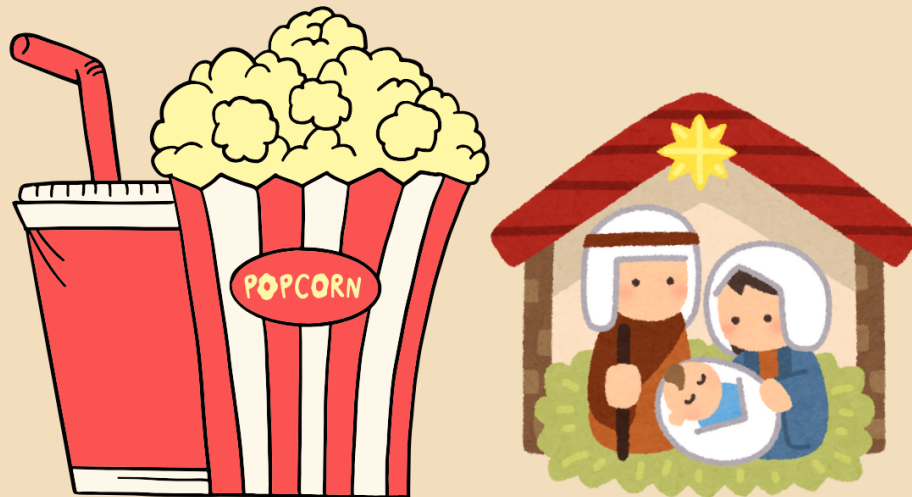
