Costume Ideas for WW2 Evacuee Day



Boys can wear their usual school trousers or shorts if they have them. If available, a flat cap would be great and a cardigan, jumper, tank top or jacket with black or brown lace up shoes.

A gas mask box and an evacuee label can be made from paper or card. Any more is an added extra!

Girls can wear a pinafore dress and beret (if they have them), or school skirts and a white blouse. Long white socks and brown or black lace ups are again ideal. Hair in plaits, or with a ribbon or head band for shorter hair.







Alternatively, they could dress as the adults that would have stayed at home in the war: married women, miners, dock workers, farmers and railway workers.
