Pancake Day

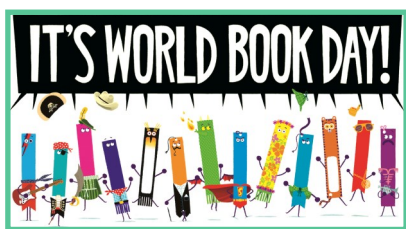

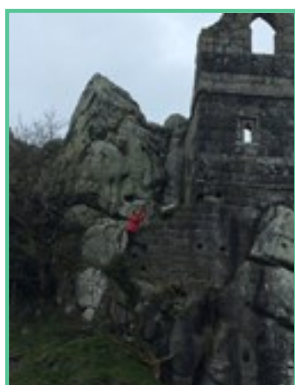
ENGLISH HERITAGE PENDENNIS CASTLE

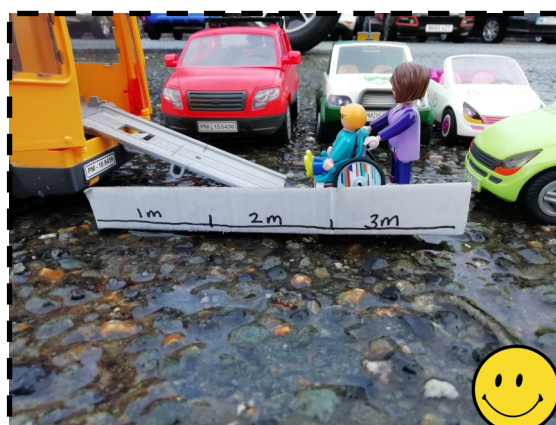


Sensory Play

This enables them to engage in the world around them and develop awareness of how their movements can manipulate and change materials.

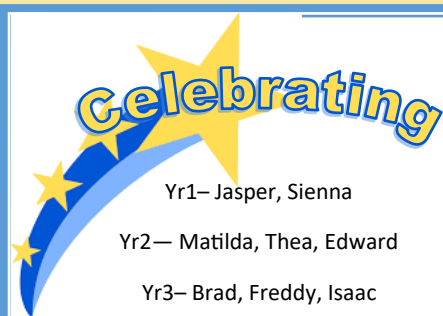
Parking:
