

## A CELEBRATE SUCCE Spring Control of Friday 2 MOUNT CHARLES SCHOOL

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Year 2 took to the streets this week and became 'Street Detectives'! They went in search of geographical

features around the local area of Mount Charles School. The children followed a map using a key and symbols to help them identify human and physical features within our community. Next, they discussed the





purpose of the different features that were observed. The children created a tally chart to record how many of each feature they spotted. They then used all of

the information that they gathered to create their own maps of the local area and bar charts to represent the data they had collected. Super detective work, year 2!





Year 3 have been studying the work of the Italian artist Archimboldo. The children used his work as inspiration for their own creations. They made



collages with pictures of fruit and vegetables and then sketched their finished pieces. They then chose pastels or paint to add colour. The results were so impressive we displayed them in the classroom

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The pupils in the ARB have been working hard developing their problem-solving skills in a range of different ways. They have been practicing counting forwards and backwards as well as using number lines to find one more and one less than a given number. The children have been playing small group games to practise turn taking, as well as extending their speaking and listening. They even managed to take advantage of the winter sunshine to experiment with bubbles and water play!








Our witches, wizards and scientists of Year 4 had a fantastically fun ENGAGE day to start their 'Potions' topic. While enjoying the magic the children looked at the science behind colour changing potions, exploding potions and slimy oobleck. They designed their own potions in their books and then decorated bottles for them to go in. The children learnt and recited extracts from Macbeth's 'Double, double toil and trouble...' What a spell binding day!

In English, Year 5 are writing nonchronological reports. On Monday the children gathered information about the moon so they would have facts to use. Using the 'Writing Rainbow' from 'The Write Stuff' they made a writing plan and used this to generate technical vocabulary and potential sentences.





In RE, Year 6 have been putting their oracy skills into practice. Each group read a short statement or story from the Bible. Two members of the group discussed what the story was trying to teach us about how we should live our lives. The third member was a "silent summariser". Their role was to listen to the discussion and pick out the key points. They made notes and then presented their summary to the class. This lesson was part of a sequence exploring our key question in RE this half term, "Is anything ever eternal?" We would love to hear if this discussion is continued at home and what thoughts and ideas you generate.
