"Do You Want To Be Friends?" has been to create a friendship feast. As a whole class and in groups the children have been thinking about the ingredients they need to show friendship. They have thought carefully about friendship and being a good friend. They have added cupfuls, sprinkles and pinches of these 'ingredients' to their very own friendship feasts!

Year 1 have been designing and creating finger puppets over the past few weeks. They thoroughly enjoyed getting inspiration from existing dinosaur puppets and used this to create their own exciting design. The children made the puppets from fabric by carefully following their design plans. They finished off the process with a dinosaur puppet show!









Year 3 have been designing their own ultimate predators as the EXPRESS task to end their topic.

The children created collages of their predators and enjoyed inventing names for them and thinking about their diet, special features and habitats.

Willow's ultimate predator was a Barcheetha. "It's a nocturnal hunter that feeds on insects and other worms. It catches its prey using the element of surprise while they sleep!"

Year 4 have been making boats out of tinfoil whilst gathering some vocabulary in preparation for how the character in their story, Lucy, will repair her boat.

They had to guess how many counters their boat would hold... one child's boat held 100. Wow!









This week Year 5 have been completing their final piece of portrait learning in art.

The children each chose one of Henry VIII's wives to sketch and paint, combining all of the techniques they have learnt over this half term.


We are super impressed with their skills!

Free School Meal Vouchers

The government has announced a new grant, the Household Support Fund, for local authorities to continue to support households with living costs during the Covid recovery period.

There is no requirement for the Household Support Fund to be used to provide holiday food vouchers for families on Free School Meals. However, Cornwall Council has taken the decision that during this particularly turbulent period due to the cessation of the £20 Universal Credit uplift, the end of furlough and rising energy costs, provision should be made from the fund to enable schools to provide holiday food vouchers for October half-term.

A voucher of £15 will be emailed to parents on Monday 25th October for every child who receives benefits related free school meals. Please note, Cornwall Council are funding one week of half term in line with the official Cornwall term dates.
