Following the government announcement on Monday evening, we can confirm that Mount Charles School will fully reopen to all of our children on Monday 8th March. We are very happy to be welcoming back our entire Mount Charles family for face to face learning. Our Covid operating procedures will remain in place for the time being, with year groups and staff staying in 'bubbles', regular hand-washing/sanitising, timetabled use

of communal areas (playgrounds/halls), etc. Please resume dropping off and collecting your children from the gates they used prior to Lockdown 3. As you will be aware, the government included in their announcement that **attendance will be mandatory for all children from Monday 8th March**. > **Preparing your child for the first day back in school.** Advice from Trauma Informed Schools UK.



<u>Be Calm.</u> Your child will take the lead from you and be reassured if you are steady and matter of fact.

<u>Be Positive.</u> Remind them of all the ways they have learnt to keep themselves safe: washing their hands regularly, sneezing and coughing into their elbow, not hugging others and staying in their own space.

<u>Be</u> Supportive.</u> Younger children in particular may struggle with separation anxiety and may become tearful, clingy or act out. Reassure them that you will miss them too and think of them throughout the day.

Be Curious. These are strange times and their imagination may run away with them. Listen, and



try not to dismiss or minimise their fears, but validate how they are feeling—"It's totally fine to feel like that at the moment" or "I can really understand why you would feel like that".

<u>Be Thankful.</u> Help your child think of things they are looking forward to: being with their friends, seeing their teacher and resuming some of their favourite activities.




YEAR 4

Home Learning Challenge



Free School Meal Vouchers




