Our children in EYFS have been

enjoying their Christmas book advent calendar. Each day, a different child's name is pulled out and they get to find the present with the correct number on to open. During the day the children read the book together and enjoy talking about each story. They have been really excited by this daily activity!

All children throughout the school are really enjoying the Christmas magic. Our PTA have provided craft materials for each year group to make festive items. There are plates, bags and tree decorations—lovely items to be treasured for years to come! The crafts will be coming home on Wednesday after payment is received. The children also each make a tree charm to hang





Our children in EYFS have worked so hard to complete their first Reading Challenge. They are now tackling Reading Challenge 2. Fantastic job!







Our Year 1 children have enjoyed getting into the festive spirit by creating Christmas decorations. They created a Christmas plate focusing on Christmas tree and Robin designs. We were blown away by the creativity - the plates look fantastic!







Our Year 2 children have been busy working on their printing skills, learning how to carve shapes, patterns and lines into a surface and printing their designs using ink. They are ready to print their final pirate flag designs next week!







Year 3 have put the finishing touches on their Ancient Greek pots. From the 6th century BC, Athenian pottery was made using iron rich soil then decorated with patterns and pictures of Gods. The children were fascinated with their research and enjoyed designing and making their own pots.







Year 4 have been designing catapults for their I Am Warrior topic. The children have practised measuring wood and safely using a hack saw to cut their wood.

Next week they will assemble all the parts and test them out - very exciting!







This week Year 5 have been creating computer-aided designs using Purple Mash. In D.T. the children have been designing their own torches and have now begun developing their designs using technology. They have thought carefully about the shape and colours used to create a realistic yet innovative design.







Year 6 have been investigating evolution in science. They looked at Darwin's research on finches who had different shaped beaks. This was because they lived on different islands which had different food sources and their beaks adapted so that they could reach the food available on that island. The children tried this out using a range of different implements such as tweezers, chopsticks, pegs and spoons and timed how long it took us to pick up large and small 'food' items.





The children in our ARB have been getting in the festive mood. They have explored winter sensory activities, helped to decorate the Christmas tree and made mince pies. The children also danced and sung along to Christmas music whilst decorating their PTA Christmas bags!





On Monday, some of our year 2 children travelled to Poltair to take part in a hockey skills festival. The children really enjoyed themselves. They learnt the basics of field hockey and were all given Christmas Santa hats for doing so well.





Our Year 4,5 and 6 runners took part in Race 2 of the Cross Country qualifiers today at Poltair School last week. Our children were amazing yet again and all finished the race in wet, muddy and slippery conditions - typical cross country weather!

Some of our Year 1 children attended a multiskills festival at Poltair School on Monday. The children enjoyed events where they had to use their agility and their throwing, tennis and football skills. The children had a fantastic time and hope to be invited again soon!
