Below are some ideas for you and your child to complete at home together. Do not feel you have to complete them all, but choose a few to enjoy together. Please encourage your child to bring in any work to share with their class.

Try mixing two colours together and see which new colour you have made. Use the colours you have made to paint a picture of a member of your family or a pet.</p> 	<p><u>Act It Out</u> Act out different household jobs. Challenge a member of your family to guess what you are doing.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * brushing your teeth * washing up * driving the car * mowing the lawn * cooking a meal * brushing your hair * climbing the stairs
<p><u>Friends</u> Friends are fabulous! Why not create a 'friends and family tree'. You could use photos or draw pictures. Use different coloured lines to draw links that represent family and friends. Talk about why families and friends are important.</p>	<p><u>Keep In Touch</u> Invite a family member or friend around, video call them or chat to them on the telephone. Talk about your favourite memories or happy experiences.</p>	<p><u>Treasure</u> Make a treasure chest out of the things that make you 'you'. Which possessions couldn't you cope without? What makes you special? Talk about all the things you are good at and why people love you.</p>
<p><u>Good Friends</u> Have you ever felt lonely? How did it make you feel? Who helped you to feel better? Talk about why friends are important and how children can be good friends to each other. Work together to make a 'Good friend checklist'. A good friend is.....</p>	<p><u>People Who Help Us</u> We have met some of the people in school who help to keep us safe and help us with our learning. Who are the important people who help us in our community? Find out about the police, ambulance or fire service. How do they help us? What is their special phone number? Can you draw and label a picture of them?</p>	<p><u>Self Portrait</u> Create a self-portrait. Look in a mirror carefully and try to add detail. You could use pencils or paints, or even get creative and use junk-modelling materials to make a 3D model.</p>
