EYFS have been settling into their new learning environments well and lots of new friendships have been made already! We are looking forward to sharing the rest of their primary experience together.





As part of Year 1's current writing unit 'The dinosaur who lost his Roar', the children engaged in a 'Creative Hook'.

This involved a T-Rex stomping its way through our corridor here at Mount Charles! The children were very excited by this and immersed themselves in role play: acting out some key vocabulary from our new story.









Year 2 have started their 'Beachcombers' topic. They have been learning all about living creatures and what they need to survive. They began by discussing habitats and microhabitats and made their very own homes for insects. The children had great fun choosing different natural materials to fill their homes and showed excellent teamwork.







Year 3 have started their new topic, Predators. They are looking forward to discovering more about these amazing creatures. On Monday, the children studied animal prints and the amazing colours and patterns found on animal skin and fur.





Year 4 have started their new topic, Blue Abyss. They children studied continents and oceans and put the world back together by arranging snippets in the correct places. The children have also learnt about how to log on to the Surface Go devices that they will use for computing and TT Rockstars.





During the engage session for their new topic: 'Off with Her Head!', Year 5 became history detectives! They looked at a range of Tudor artefacts from the Royal Cornwall Museum and predicted what the objects could be and what they may have been used for.







Year 6 have had fun dissecting hearts as part of their Engage into the Blood Heart topic. In this topic, the children will learn all about the function of the heart and the circulatory system. They will also be reading Pig Heart Boy in our whole-class reading lessons which will encourage good debate and analytical thinking.
