It's a 'Bright Lights, Big City' topic for Year


1. They have been learning all about the
Queen and on Monday they received a
special message from her and an invitation
to a royal banquet! They dressed in their
best clothes, decorated their own crowns
and made some jam tarts to share whilst
listening to the National Anthem. Year 1
have started to discuss comparisons of life
in Cornwall to life in London.





Year 2 went to Charlestown to explore the harbour and Shipwreck Centre for their 'Land Ahoy' topic. In the Shipwreck Centre they looked at treasures that were once lost at sea and have been rescued and now displayed in the museum. They found cannon balls, silver and gold coins, anchors, a compass and many more items found on ships!

Down by the harbour they identified parts of the ship including the helm to steer the ship and masts to support the sails. To finish, they had some time on the beach where they soaked up the sea air and saw some boats out at sea.



On their 'Scrumdiddlyumptious' engage day, Year 3 studied, smelt, tasted and drew a variety of fruits and vegetables. They then studied the artist Arcimboldo and copied his work by creating fruit and vegetable sculptures. In the coming weeks, they will be learning about where different foods come from. They will also be learning about how to choose a healthy and varied diet as part of a healthy lifestyle.

Year 4 are enjoying their 'Potions' topic. They have been looking at the properties of solids, liquids and gases, how temperature affects water and chemical reactions between substances. This week they designed their own potions and used their writing skills to create a 'recipe' and evaluate their work. They came to school dressed a witches and wizards to really get into the magical spirit!





For their topic 'Blood Heart', Year 6 are learning about the function of the heart. They have drawn and labelled diagrams of the heart and looked in detail at how the heart pumps blood around the body. The children were given the opportunity to dissect a real lamb's heart and identify and label the parts. The children thoroughly enjoyed this activity and were intrigued to find out what a real heart looks like. Dissecting the heart helped the children understand the importance of the heart and how it works. There was a real buzz across Year 6 for the whole day.

The children are already well underway with their Spring 1 topic. As you have seen, many exciting 'engage' activities have ignited curious minds and a thirst for learning. If you are happy for your child to walk home alone, or if your child will be collected by someone else, please send a message to the teacher through Class Dojo. Any student who cannot return home, will be looked after at the school until the parents or carers can be contacted.

At Mount Charles punctuality is important. We expect children to arrive on time every day.

Our gates open at 8:30am, when children are welcomed by their class teachers and complete some early morning maths. Registration is at 8:45am and our maths lessons begin at 8:50am - please ensure your child is in school by 8:45am.

Please note that the classroom doors will be locked at 8:45am, and any children arriving after this time must enter through the main entrance. Any latecomers will need to give a valid reason for the late arrival.
