EYFS have been exploring foods that wild animals eat to reflect their Imaginative Learning Project (ILP) this half term 'Why Do Squirrels Hide Their Nuts?'. The children used a wide range of key vocabulary to describe what they could see, feel and smell. They discussed the differences between the animal food and the food that humans eat. The children expressed that they definitely didn't want to be served animal food at lunch!









Year 1 have been making the most of the new blue soft surface in the Key Stage One playground. The children enjoyed a fun game of 'domes and dishes' followed by a session focused on racket skills.







Year 2 have been experimenting with pencil and charcoal to create different textures, lines and shapes. The children explored shading to create light and dark tones. They will be using these skills to help create their pirate flags over the next couple of weeks. Keep your eyes peeled for the finished pieces!







In science this week, Year 3 created an experiment to test the friction of different surfaces. The four surfaces they chose were bubble wrap, sand paper, rubber mat and carpet. They had to carefully hold the board at certain heights until the car started moving and rolled to the end of the board. The children enjoyed working as a team to reach their conclusions.







This half term, Year 4 have been exploring Maya Angelou's poem 'Still I Rise'. The children have written their own poem in the same style, but focused on climate change instead. They are so proud of their finished poems, and so are we!







Year 5 have conducted a science experiment exploring sieving and filtration. They used filters, sieves, stones, sand and oil. The children made predictions based upon their understanding of how we can separate mixtures. They had fun with this activity and explored lots of new learning.





Our children in the ARB have continued with their 'Superheroes' topic. They have enjoyed the story 'The Three Little Super -Pigs' and lots of activities related to it. The children made their very own handprint superheroes and superhero power packs to help them 'fly', leap, jump and hop!

We wore odd socks at school on Monday to show support for Anti-Bullying week. Odd socks symbolise that we are all different and that children should be themselves, accepting of one another and celebrate difference.







Year 6 have been writing their first narrative using The Write Stuff approach. They are writing a story based on a child's experience of being evacuated at the start of World War II. They have been using their experiences from the Evacuee Day and the Sentence Stacking lessons to focus on developing a range on emotive vocabulary and sentence structures. We can't wait to read them once they're finished and edited.

Cornwall Council have been awarded £4.5million to support our community as we continue to recover from the effects of the pandemic.
