Year 4—Blue Abyss



Year 4 are enjoying their Blue Abyss ILP. In science they are learning about living things and comparing living things in our local area to the wider environment. They have been exploring food chains and investigating how environmental changes can sometimes pose dangers to living things. With these dangers in mind, year 4 have written fantastic persuasive letters encouraging people to think about their plastic waste and how this waste affects our oceans.

In art, year 4 have been studying Georges Seurat and the technique of pointillism. They have linked this this to their Blue Abyss ILP and created pieces of artwork using fish as a stimulus.



Look at these fantastic design and technology skills! As part of their Predators topic, year 3 were tasked with creating their own rainforest - a natural habitat for many predators such as snakes and tarantulas.



Year 5 have been taking part in African (Djembe) drumming sessions this term. Djembe drums are a common African tribal instrument said to have been invented in the 12th century, and played for generations forming an integral part of

ritualistic life in Africa. The children are learning about musical terms and notation and are really enjoying their drumming sessions!


