EYFS thoroughly enjoyed engaging in their new ILP 'Who Lives in a Rockpool?' The children spent a day at Porthpean Beach and had lots of fun taking part in different beach activities such as rock-pooling and beach art. A firm favourite was definitely paddling their feet in the sea! "It's so cold!!", "It feels cool in the sunshine". After lunch, they all cooled down under a gazebo with an ice pole. "I love beach day!"



Year 1 launched their new topic, 'Paws, Claws and Whiskers'

by inviting the children to bring in a cuddly animal or a photograph of a pet. The children had a great time learning how to look after their friends' different "pets" and created posters to share information of their "pets" care needs.







Year 2 have started their new design technology topic, where

they will be learning about toys that move and making their own mechanical minibeasts. So far, they have learnt all about mechanisms, levers, pivots and linkages. They talked about how and why some toys would need these parts and then compared a range of toys. The children are looking forward to experimenting with levers and linkages before creating their final projects!



On Friday, Year 3 enjoyed a tennis coaching session. They learnt about controlling the ball and how to handle and use a tennis racket. By the end of the session, the children were all able to hit the ball over the net to their partner. Brilliant!





Year 4 have started their topic Misty Mountain Sierra by making mountains. They started by making junk models which were then covered in Modroc and finally painted. The children have also studied how the appearance of a mountain changes as the altitude rises.





Year 5 have had a fantastic time learning how to play a variety of brass instruments including the cornet, miniature cornet and the trumpet. They are working towards an end-of-term performance where they can show-off their new skills to friends and family!







Year 6 have been enjoying rugby coaching by Mr Smith from the Cornish Pirates. They have been learning how to pass and catch a rugby ball and playing a variety of games involving team-work and basic skills.

**Uniform:** Thank you to our families who have supported our school in raising uniform standards. Unfortunately we are still seeing children arrive at school wearing incorrect uniform, such as:

- Coloured or sparkly footwear,
- ✗ Tights/leggings with summer dresses,
- × Multicoloured tights,
- × Necklaces,
- \* Headpieces and hairbands (e.g. Cat ears/unicorns)

#### To clarify, our uniform is:

- ✓ Black shoes, (not trainers),
- ✓ Only white socks to be worn with summer dresses,
- ✓ Grey socks/tights, (unless wearing white socks with a summer dress),
- ✓ No jewellery should be worn in school except one pair of small stud earrings,
- ✓ Only simple hair bands should be worn, no elaborate pieces. Long hair must be tied back. Please label all items of clothing to ensure items can be returned to their rightful owners.

Lockdown Drill: CELT schools practise lockdown of the school regularly like we do fire drills. All schools have an Emergency Lockdown Procedure in place in case of incidences such as a dangerous dog in the area or a gas leak. Next week, we will be practicing what we would do in such circumstances. The school bell will sound, staff will ensure that all doors and windows are locked and nobody will be leaving or entering the grounds. Teaching will continue during the drill. 
