

On Friday 15th June our A team won the St Austell Primary School's Swimming Gala for the 19th successive year! The gala, which involves ten local schools split in to two leagues, involves thirteen races with points allocated for finishing positions in each race. All races are team events with front crawl (3 x 25 m), medley (backstroke, breast stroke and front crawl) and Cannon (6 x 25 m boys and girls mixed) relays. Twenty one



of our Speed swimmers were involved on the day and they really did the school proud producing ten season best times!!. There is always a certain amount of pressure on Mount Charles because of our past record and I know all of the adult helpers certainly felt it on the day! Despite the pressure our children were excellent and a credit to their families and the school.

Out of 13 races they achieved: -

5 x 1<sup>st</sup> places, 4 x 2<sup>nd</sup> places, 2 x 3<sup>rd</sup> places, 2 x 4<sup>th</sup> places

This resulted in 51 points which was the top score on the day.
